Fast Forward Into Advent



How soon do you respond when someone tells you "It's time for...?" If you've gone immediately in the past, only to have to wait for them, you might delay this time. Weddings always start late, don't they? Apparently that's

been the case for centuries. My, how time drags when nothing is changing; and how easily doubts arise when there is something about to happen! Look how Isaiah longs for actions on God's part in Isaiah 64:1-9! He's remembering the "good old days." Without reminders about the passage of time, we can become as sleepy as the watchmen in Mark 13:24-37. Yet when the Master returns, we will not be able to fast-forward through all the preparations; now is the time to keep vigilant, watch! Fortunately, we are "not lacking in any spiritual gift" (from 1 Corinthians 1:3-9) as we await his return. But this coming one is outside time and space whose promises are eternal. Notice that Mark 1:1-8 only announces the beginning of the Good News. The Gospel continues to our day and forever. How shall we reflect this eternal promise? In John 1, John the Baptist is joyful he had the honor of introducing the Light of the World. Let a little of God's light shine on through you. Eternity reminds us that a kingdom is not built in a day. In 2 Samuel: 7 we are reminded that David's throne will be established forever and the certainty of this eternal kingdom comes to Mary, a teenage girl. In Luke 1 Mary's "Let it be." can be ours in this season of God coming among us. For a

while we are limited by time and space. Let us use them to prepare for eternity. What gift has God given you with which to prepare? Even so, Lord Jesus, quickly come!

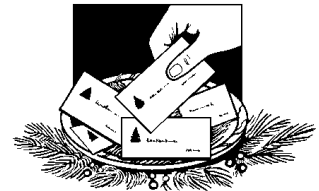

From Our Missionary:

Dear Friends in Christ, Greetings from Japan!

One of the interesting parts of my job involves writing and presenting chapel speeches every 2 or 3 weeks. I do my part in English, while the chaplain alternates with me and reads the Japanese translation. The number one thing I try to focus on as I prepare a chapel speech is my audience. I am speaking to junior high and high school students primarily, but the teachers are also listening. The goal is to help students learn more about Christianity while also learning some English. Most of the students are not Christian, so it is important for me to explain very basic Christian ideas while using very simple English. I try to talk about issues that matter to teenagers and use examples that students can relate to.

Jesus understood how to connect with the crowds he taught. He used words that people knew and understood, and he considered the background of his audience. When possible, he used examples and analogies from people's everyday lives. Jesus could have tried to impress people with his vast intimate knowledge about God or used fancy words that a person could only decipher if they had a dictionary handy. Instead, Jesus chose to teach ordinary people in a way that best showed just how extraordinary God is.

Some chapel speeches that I write are better than others, but it is still my hope that I can follow Jesus's example of how to be a good teacher. Here is just one of my recent chapel speeches, but I plan to post others in the future. Enjoy!

Today's Bible reading is from Ephesians 3:17b-19. "And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God."

What is your dream for the future? What do you want to be when you grow up?

Recently, I read a story about an amazing Japanese Christian named Shimeta Niishima*. He was born in 1843, and he was the son of a samurai. He studied hard to become a good samurai and a good scholar. When he was 16 years old, his dream was to learn about the world. He wanted to be a scholar-warrior. Then, he could help Japan trade with other countries and understand ideas from all over the world.

Niishima secretly read books from other countries and studied the Bible. At that time, signs said, "Reward for the capture of Christians! Death to the followers of Jesus." Niishima knew it was dangerous, but he believed in God and became a Christian.

It was also illegal at that time to leave Japan, but Niishima wanted to learn more. He secretly got on a ship and went to America. In America, he studied very hard. He went to a preparatory school, college, and then seminary to become a pastor. Niishima's new dream was to start a Christian university in Japan.

After ten years, Niishima returned to Japan. In 1875, he built Doshisha Academy in Kyoto. He was only 32 years old, but he had already accomplished many things. Niishima wanted Doshisha to become a university to make Christian leaders for Japan: lawyers, professors, ministers, businessmen, and statesmen. He devoted his life to making his dream come true. In 1890, Niishima showed his strong faith as he said his last words, "Peace, joy, heaven!" After he died, other people carried on this work.

Today, Doshisha is a university with over 25,000 students. It is a symbol of Niishima's faith, hard work, and dreams. I hope that all of us can follow Niishima's example, and achieve great things in the future.

Let us pray. Dear Lord, Thank you for the chance to learn. Help us to do our best and to work hard as we study. Please guide us as we try to achieve our dreams. In Your name we pray, amen.

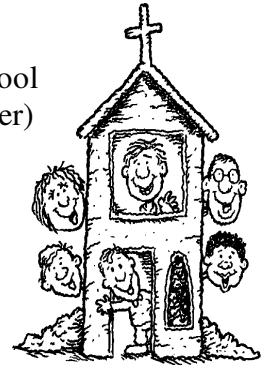
Children's Christmas Program "Christmas In A Box"

Fair Trade chocolate has arrived once again for the holidays!

This year, our Fair Trade ministry features two new candy bars -- Dark Chocolate Hazelnut Truffle and Orange Milk Chocolate. We introduced them at the recent **Fall for Fair Trade**, sponsored by the Northern Conference of the Women of the ELC and they sold out! Mmm, sweet chocolate! But the truth is, chocolate isn't always so sweet. More often than not, it's tainted with the tears of literally thousands of child slaves on the Ivory Coast which produces most of the world's cocoa. Children, as young as nine years old, are trafficked through slave traders, or they're lured to cocoa farms with the promise of money. After they arrive, the children often work 12 to 15-hour days clearing the fields and harvesting the beans that are made into chocolate. They are underfed, never paid, live and work in harsh conditions, and are beaten and broken like horses when they don't perform well. The end result for their backbreaking labor is a fancy-wrapped chocolate bar, mostly for consumers in America, Canada and Europe. Sadly, these children have never even tasted chocolate themselves.

Although markets for Fair Trade chocolate, produced by small-scale cocoa farmers, remain small, they are steadily growing. All Fair Trade chocolate is free of child slave labor. Each purchase helps to provide nutritious food, school supplies, medicine and education for the families of cocoa farmers. Also, a big portion of each purchase goes towards improving the communities where the cocoa is produced.

Large chocolate bars are \$3 each, and small ones are \$1.50. They may be pricier than some you'll find on store shelves, but the reality is that prices reflect the cost of production. Please help alleviate child slavery by purchasing Fair Trade chocolate and other products.

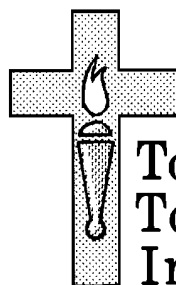

Next year's envelopes will be available on Sunday, Dec. 18 and afterwards. We all have a busy month, and we are trying to keep everything in order.

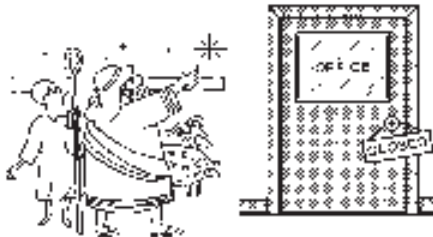
BIBLES FOR MADAGASCAR –

Christ Caring Concerns: Members of the council contacted at least 2 congregation members to ask whether they had any questions about the proposed Alpha program. Questions were collected and will be answered as part of "Frequently Asked Questions" to help give the congregation more information about the Alpha program. WWW.AlphaUSA.org is a website to find out more about this program of spiritual growth.

Prayer concerns were shared. Devotion was given by Rene Dornan.

Sharing the Vision:

Evangelism: Plan to begin the Alpha Program in Lent on Wednesday evenings in lieu of Lenten worship services. Council is still looking for coordinator(s) for the Alpha program.

Local ELCA churches will sponsor an ad in the Journal Star at Christmas advertising dates and times of Christmas services.

Community Involvement: Human Service Thanksgiving Dinner is will be Tuesday, November 22.

Rerooting: In an attempt to find out more about the needs of the neighborhoods around Grace and Peace, Pastor has contacted Peoria City and County officials to ask for their feedback on how our congregation can better serve our neighbors.

Thrivent: Thrivent Choice dollars from Grace and Peace Thrivent members were used to provide food baskets for LSSI clients and also help purchase some of the Christmas gifts for LSSI kids.

Additional donations from Thrivent Choice will be donated to ELCA Good Gifts to provide bibles to households in Madagascar, per the request of the Malagasy Bishop who visited Grace and Peace earlier this year.

Pastor's report: Written report submitted.

Pastor will be on vacation from November 25 through December 3.

Upcoming youth events: January 15-16: Junior and Senior High lockin 10pm to 5am Landmark Recreation Center.

February 25-25: Be Like Jesus for older grade school youth.

Old Business:

Sanctuary Projection System: No report from task force.

Stewardship Kickoff Event: Mark reported good feedback about the service and brunch at Barracks. Almost 80 people were in attendance.

Budget: Preliminary budget for 2012 was presented. There is a gap between budgeted expenses and expected income. The Association of Lutheran Church Musicians guidelines were used to recommend salaries for the organist and choir director.

They will be contacting members of the congregation soliciting candidates for Council, Endowment Ministry, Nominating Committee and Synod Assembly Delegates.

Finance Ministry recommended that Carol Gard be appointed by the Council to a 3 year term on the Audit Committee starting in 2012. Dave Dietrich made the motion, Nan Goff seconded, motion approved.

Craig Lorentz, Terry Goff, with Pastor Shelksohn as advisor will solicit other members of the congregation to form a Search Committee for the Evangelist position. Though the congregation needs to approve this position at the annual meeting, the council thought that having a search committee in place would speed the process of filling this position.

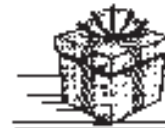
